PURPOSE

Youth Leadership Academy of Madison County is an exciting program for high school juniors. Through personal development, leadership training and community awareness, YLA prepares passionate, servant-minded students for a life of leadership.

During the program the students attend a three-day, two-night kick-off retreat at the Camp Tecumseh YMCA camp taking place July 13-15, 2018. Following will be eleven sessions September through March (see back for schedule).

WHO

- Students who will be juniors in the 2018-2019 school year
- Students who demonstrate leadership potential in school and/or community activities
- Students who are interested in making a successful transition to college and career
- Students who are willing to commit to full participation in the program. They must maintain satisfactory academic, attendance and citizenship records.

WHY YLA?

- 1. Students will cultivate a sense of self-awareness through:**
 - a. Identifying personal values and beliefs
 - b. Building a vision for their future
 - c. Participating in self-assessment and self-reflection
- 2. Students will develop the ability to interrelate and establish meaningful relationships with others through:**
 - a. Developing interpersonal skills such as communication, cooperation, and collaboration
 - b. Building meaningful relationships with peers, leaders, and community members
 - c. Leading in group activities, experiencing group dynamics and actively participating in teamwork
 - d. Expanding the knowledge of human differences and developing an appreciation and sensitivity to those differences
 - e. Practicing inclusiveness and acceptance
- 3. Students will cultivate a sense of community awareness through:**
 - a. Developing an awareness of current community needs and challenges
 - b. Developing a sense of social responsibility and commitment to service
 - c. Experiencing, understanding, and supporting philanthropic work in the community
- 4. Students will gain knowledge and understanding of the servant leadership theory through:**
 - a. Defining the meaning of servant leadership
 - b. Demonstrating associated servant leadership skills

COST
